

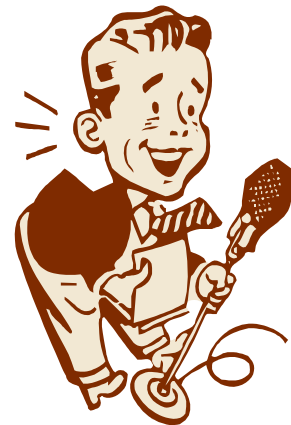


The Baseball Heritage Museum Announces
